

Implementation Strategies

THE MISSION

"To transform and enrich the daily and faith lives of all people through creative and meaningful songs and musical experiences."

Through *Seasonal Scriptures in Song*, new hymns or songs are created to aid in learning Bible verses or passages pertaining to church seasons and growing one's Scriptural foundation. Learning scripture by heart through song is a devotional exercise, a matter of the heart.

This mission is grounded in Colossians 3:16, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord." While the mission is initially manifested in scripture based song, the vision of *Seasonal Scriptures in Song* is to realize:

- Many lives, across the globe, enriched and transformed, having embodied scripture through music and song;
- An ongoing and creative means to assist teachers, parents, pastors, music directors, children, families, and congregations embody the scriptures through song;
- A transformative, growing, and readily available canon of music for small and large churches alike all around the world.

...here are some strategies:

Teach all students the song so that it can be used:

- **†** Each week in chapel at a designated place of the service
- **†** As a prayer for each class to sing or speak at a specific time of the day
- At times when the students are scared, worried, overwhelmed, etc. (guidance in how to do so will be needed)

Age-appropriate learning about words in the passage and the context of the verse itself
Create art projects based on the given text, which will be shared on the project website

The song is made available to families via printed format, within the school newsletter, and/or the secure portion of the school website to be utilized by families at home during bedtime, mealtime, as a sung blessing before everyone leaves for work or school, etc.

Devotional questions based on the verses or passages:

- How has God...(i.e. comforted you in your distress today Psalm 119:50)?
- **†** How can the text of the *Seasonal Scriptures in Song* apply to your life and faith today/this week?
- **†** How can the text of the *Seasonal Scriptures in Song* be used in answering various devotional questions during classes or Bible studies? (see example on page four)

Teachers have the option of including the song as the week's memory verse

School choirs can:

- Learn the song to be sung in chapel, in worship, or as a prayer warmup at the beginning of rehearsal
- **†** Utilize the song as a tool for developing musicality
- Employ the tune in teaching music elements:
 - 🕇 Rhythm
 - **†** Melody
 - **†** Dynamics
 - **†** Harmony
 - **†** Movement sign language, etc.

Incorporate the song and/or text into games and activities:

- Jump Rope Rhymes
- **†** Four Square Challenges
- **†** Version of "Horse" for basketball, etc.

Depending on the Patreon Contribution Level, the school or church could:

- **†** Request a specific verse or passage to be set to music for a given month
- Ask for orchestrations to be used by the school band (skill development) or other church musicians
- Within the worship setting, the *Seasonal Scriptures in Song* could be sung integrated into these possible elements as:
 - 🕇 A Kyrie
 - **†** A Hymn of Praise or Thanksgiving
 - An Offertory Response
 - **†** A response to the readings
 - **†** A prayer or prayer reflection, etc.
 - **†** All of the above will be based on the text befitting the usage

Sunday school programs can include the *Seasonal Scriptures in Song* in these possible ways:

- Learn the songs to be sung as a group for worship, having learned the song (Scripture verse/passage) by heart
- t Utilize the songs as a prayer to begin the Sunday School "hour" whether as individual classes or in larger group settings
- The song is made available to families via printed format within the order of worship or information bulletin/newsletter to be utilized by families at home during bedtime, mealtime, as a sung blessing before everyone leaves for work or school, etc.

As a reminder, all of the above are suggestions to provide a starting point for how the songs can be incorporated. That said, any ideas or methods created beyond what's offered are encouraged. Also, please share with me how you are utilizing the *Seasonal Scriptures in Song* so that I can add the options to the list.
